REV. DR. ROBERT L. POLK '52

The Rev. Dr. Robert L. Polk was born in 1928, the youngest of six children who lived with their parents on the South Side of Chicago. In 1952 he graduated from Doane College, becoming the first Black student to do so. He later received his Master of Divinity degree from Hartford Theological Seminary.

His ministry has been wide and diverse. He served an all-white rural parish in North Dakota, worked as a YMCA youth director, Minister to Youth at Riverside Church, Dean of Chapel and Dean of Students at Dillard University in New Orleans, directed a Child Welfare agency and worked in areas of civil rights, prison ministry, HIV-Aids and community service. He has served on a number of boards and committees throughout his career with an emphasis on race and social justice.

Polk has authored three books: Crossing Barriers and Building Bridges, Tight Little Island and Fly in the Buttermilk: One Black Man's Odyssey Out on the Prairie.
